Empowering Every Learner and Adult by Achieving a Universal Starting Point

Methods to accommodate different language and cognitive abilities through skill and teaching modifications will be targeted,

Attendees will identify and apply relevant ethical standards crucial for making informed medical necessity determinations, ensuring the highest level of care for their clients.
